Shelley, a SNIPPP volunteer, alerted us to this beautiful boy that had apparently been dumped on an isolated road. He appeared very friendly but had no interest in getting in a car. So, fliers were put up, alerts on Facebook made and volunteers started going out to leave food and water. We of course were sure someone would come forward. But no one did. He just waited in the same place not understanding why he had been abandoned. Our volunteers had no luck



getting a harness or lead around him. He would jump into a vehicle for something particularly delicious but rapidly exit. Patience, time and more time passed. We worried because there are lots of dangerous critters out where he was staying. Our volunteers were determined to save him. And finally volunteer Sandra was able to slip a lead around his neck. Once that happened he became totally compliant. He knows his command and looks to be in great condition. He has settled into Sandra's home hoping this will be a foster fail.

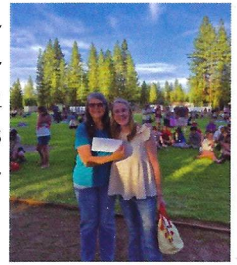

New Scholarship Available to High School Seniors

An annual scholarship fund has been created at SNIPPP titled the "SNIPPP-MuttMatchers Inter-mountain Kindness Scholarship." Its goal is to support the ongoing education of students graduating from Fall River Junior/Senior High School, Burney High School, Big Valley High School and Mountain View High School who have exhibited acts of kindness and compassion as identified by their school peers. Emphasis on kindness or care towards animals will be considered as part of the award criteria as well as a demonstrated financial need.

Annually, for a minimum of 5 years, a \$750 (Seven Hundred and Fifty dollar) scholarship will be awarded to one graduating Senior from each of the high schools in the SNIPPP service area of: Fall River Junior/Senior, Burney, Big Valley and Mountain View High Schools. The first scholarships will be issued in 2026. These funds will be from anonymous grants, not reducing the funds donated to SNIPPP.

The Latest Numbers

It's been awhile since we shared statistics on what SNIPPP accomplished. Figures through last year and this year to date (thru Aug), in terms of Spay and Neuter Vouchers redeemed at our three wonderful veterinary partners: Burney Veterinary Hospital, Fall River Veterinary Hospital, and Modoc Veterinary Clinic in Adin are:

- 2024 Total Dogs Spayed or Neutered – 260
- 2024 Total Cats Spayed or Neutered – 391
- 2025 Total Dogs Spayed or Neutered – 139
- 2025 Total Cats Spayed or Neutered – 200
- Total since 2007 – over 10,000.

SNIPPP Rescues in Big Bend



The SNIPPP organization assisted the Shasta County Animal Control division with a rescue operation in the Big Bend area this past July. A long-time member of SNIPPP, Laureen, has been working in the Big Bend area for years and has built a trusting relationship with both the extremely marginalized and stable parts of that society. In this case, it was the Big Bend Rancheria of the Pit River Native American Tribe. In all, there were 23 dogs removed from the Rancheria. Without her help, Animal Control would not have been able to reach out and recover these dogs.

Sadly, SNIPPP does not have the volunteer fosters we used to and could not accommodate the rescued dogs so they all went to Haven Humane. Unfortunately, some were euthanized immediately due to their poor health. Former SNIPPP VP, Michelle Titus, acted as a liaison with the SPCA of Northern Nevada in Reno. They agreed to help with a litter of 8-week old puppies, so she travelled back and forth from Reno to transport eight puppies to give them a better life. After receiving vaccines and necessary care in Reno, they were all quickly adopted! The adult dogs that remained in Redding were also all adopted through Haven Humane.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE

The causes of Animal Welfare and Animal Rescue are complex and heartbreaking at times. Since its formation in 2007, SNIPPP has provided funding for over 10,000 spay and neuter vouchers and has saved thousands of animals through its local rescue efforts.

SNIPPP struggles with the same challenges most Animal Welfare agencies face: funding, staffing (the need for volunteers, fosters, support), and increasing demand and increasing costs. SNIPPP has the additional complications of having no paid staff, no pet kennel facilities and no office.

SNIPPP has an overwhelming need for volunteers. *Without a dedicated group of volunteers, we struggle to survive and are at the risk of not being able to provide our services to our local animal communities.*
